We are well into 2023 now and moving toward the close of the financial year.

As a business we are glad to have expanded our Health, Safety, Environment and Quality coverage throughout the business. As I write this we are nearing the launch of a new integrated management system (IMS) platform which will be easier to use and will contain a number of simplified documents and procedures. Over the balance of the year we will continue to simplify the procedures to ensure the IMS is everyone's first point of call when doing something new. Our safety efforts this year have been good as we continue to drive our TRIFR down which is a direct reflection of our supervision and site management ultimately ensuring

everyone goes home safely and making Centrals a tier one choice for our clients.

Our mining services projects continue to deliver for our clients, with some recent wet weather making site life a little more interesting. I was really pleased to be at DeGrussa for the pre start on international women's day and for half our operators at that prestart being female as we work to solidifying our female participation at over 30 percent in the near term. The proportion of female employees is fluctuating between 23 and 28 percent currently.

Our direct first nation employment is reasonably static at 11% and we intend over the coming year to continue to provide Western Australian Aboriginal people and businesses with opportunities within Centrals business and operations.

To some extend providing genuine career outcomes is more important than the gross number of employees as Centrals helps in the ways that we can to close the gap that still exists between opportunities provided to first nation people as opposed to non-first nation people.

The construction division has been busy in the early part of the year working on four of five projects and recently finishing the Tuckabianna tails facility and nearing completion of the Bellevue Air Strip, which has been completed to an outstanding standard. The challenge, as ever, with the construction division is keeping the pipeline of work open and our estimators have been working on a number of great opportunities to do this.

The Geraldton workshop has seen some changes and is adopting very positive team work standards as it looks to increase quality of service and support with evident positive change noted on each of my recent visits

Finally I'm really proud of our work and the effort put in by our loyal employees and I again thank you for your efforts and implore you to keep yourself and those around you safe.

Bellevue Project

In April (weather depending), Centrals will complete the Bellevue Aerodrome project for their client IGO at the Cosmos Nickel Mine.

Heath Whyte and his team have successfully turned what initially was a (relatively simple) pavement refurbishment, to now include supplementary roadworks, TSF earthworks, and additional drainage installations to almost double the initial project value.



Together with Jacob Short and Gavan Wright, they have worked with the client to develop a fit for purpose pavement solution whilst nurturing a relatively new work team that has been able to deliver under budget and ahead of time for their client. Further to this, the site team has recorded significant female participation numbers to lead the way for projects within the business.

Iluka Resources



Centrals is currently engaged by Iluka Resources to complete screening and earthmoving activities at Eneabba as part of the Eneabba mineral sands recovery project.

The project is an exciting project and one that Centrals is pleased to be a part of. The project involves the extraction and processing of a monazite rich stockpile that has been stored in a mining void at Eneabba since the early 1990s.

Monazite is a heavy mineral containing the rare earth elements that are used in the manufacture of electric motors, wind turbines and other renewable energy technologies, making monazite an increasingly valuable resource for the future.

We started at Eneabba in May 2022 on a short-term contract, the site

team of 6 were able to integrate themselves well with the client while also exceeding the client's haulage expectations, these efforts resulted in a long-term contract being secured. Over the past couple of months we have been able to establish a more permanent work area. Due to the lack of suitable materials on site this included importing gravel to ensure we were providing a safe work environment for the team.

In addition to the project at Eneabba, we have recently secured a smaller scope of work providing loader operators to Iluka in Geraldton. This is a credit to the positive client relationships the team has built.
